# ENGI E4000 PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND LEADERSHIP FALL 2019 COURSE SYLLABUS

### **Course Management Team**

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#### **Course Description**

Columbia Engineers have outstanding technical competencies, analytic abilities and are skilled at working in a collaborative environment that embraces interdisciplinary thought. The Professional Development and Leadership course aims to enhance and expand Columbia Engineering graduate students' interpersonal, professional and leadership skills. Students in the course will build upon and enhance their interpersonal and intrapersonal skills to further distinguishing themselves in academia and in their careers. ENGI E4000 is an M.S. degree requirement.

# **Course Objectives**

Students will engage, learn and share their experiences in order to make meaning of professional development and leadership. The students will:

- 1. Gain knowledge, skills and experience that increase ability and motivation to effect positive change, contribute to society, and develop meaning.
- 2. Prepare to launch your career by developing skills in writing, interviewing, cultivating a professional network, etc. Recognize the skills necessary to compete effectively.
- 3. Develop skills to succeed and grow your career, such as communication, project/time/stress management, programming/technical tools, and professional composure and appeal.
- 4. Develop your leadership, followership and teamwork skills through engagement, observation and reflection. Engage in experiential exercises and thought-provoking cases to cultivate ethical behavior and values.

# **Grading and Preparation**

The course is graded pass/D/fail and the grade is given at the end of the second term of enrollment. You will pass the class at the end of the spring semester, provided you:

#### 1. Attend and engage in all (10) sessions of the course.

Professional development is an engaging process. We expect you to prepare, attend, and engage in each class. Attendance is taken at the beginning and conclusion of each session.

#### 2. Complete the required assignments in a timely and ethical manner.

#### **Course Meeting Times**

1. OVERVIEW & IN-PERSON COMMUNICATION	Course overview; augment your in-person communication skills to inspire, persuade and provoke change.
2. RESUME	Prepare your US professional resume to successfully compete in the job market.
3. BUSINESS WRITING	Learn to write professional correspondences; create effective cover letters and learn strategies to maintain contact with your professional network.
4. SOCIAL MEDIA AND JOB SEA	RCH Leverage social media for your career development and professional network.
5. EXECUTIVE PRESENCE	Identify and practice verbal and non-verbal techniques that will enhance any presentation or interaction.
6. ACADEMIC AND PROFESSION ETHICS AND INTEGRITY	Elevate your academic and professional ethics (global and micro perspectives), values, and integrity.
7. ELECTIVE (1 of 4)	Select an elective from a set designated as Life Management.
8. ELECTIVE (2 of 4)	Select topics from a given list, based on your interest.
9. ELECTIVE (3 of 4)	Select topics from a given list, based on your interest.
10. ELECTIVE (4 of 4)	Select topics from a given list, based on your interest.
